Traditional woodworking demands skill and patience and **Richard Humpidge** shows plenty of both when he turns locally gathered greenwood into furniture and other craft items. During this coming Sunday and Monday, Richard will be at West Winds again where he will **demonstrate his skills** – and if it rains, his patience too – in the tea-garden.

Richard will be showing how he makes some of his classic items, including chairs, coffee tables, bird boxes and woven seats. He'll also be bringing a range of toys to sell, including his trademark dinosaur jigsaws (left).

This is an ideal opportunity to bring the children and let Richard show them what can be done with a simple lump of Wharfedale wood. Naturally there will also be a craftsman-like – but less chewy – menu in the tearoom to explore too, so why not make a day of it?

Richard will be at West Winds on **Sunday 28** and **Monday 29 August 2011** from 12.30pm to 6pm.

Bill Mitchell holds tearoom spellbound with tales of Alfred Wainwright



Historian, author and raconteur **Bill Mitchell MBE** (left, holding book) brought some of his many books to West Winds earlier this month, signing copies, reading extracts and talking about old Yorkshire.

WR Mitchell was born in Skipton in 1928. After gaining journalistic experience on the *Craven Herald*, he joined the *Dalesman* in 1948. In 1968 he became Editor, a role he continued for the next 20 years. Bill also edited the sister magazine *Cumbria* for many years. He retired in 1988, but continued to write about Yorkshire, producing well over 100 books and many articles for magazines and local newspapers.

Bill Mitchell is the first to admit that Yorkshire and the Dales have changed over eight decades but he remains philosophical about the impact of modern life. He said: "It's nice to remember the old Dales but also nice to live in the new Dales. The Dales may have changed but there is an eternal quality to life here."
