Originally an iron worker from Cleckheaton in the West Riding of Yorkshire, he was given the secret recipe from a man who owed him money. The man couldn't repay him in cash and opted instead to hand over his treasured family recipe.

Now the company is based at Hexham (farther up the Pennines) and makes all sorts of traditionally brewed soft drinks, including **rose lemonade**, **dandelion and burdock**, **ginger beer and others**. You can try them at West Winds.

Fentiman's drinks are just one of the additions we have made to the menu for spring 2011. You can also tuck into cashew nut pie with parsnip and carrot cakes, discover West Riding pudding or totally indulge yourself with liquorice cake, baked with Pontefract-made liquorice.

We are always looking out for authentic Yorkshire produce and old recipes and are on a mission to show that Yorkshire cuisine can be as tasty as that from anywhere.

Spring rain adds extra inches to food plants in West Winds garden



"A good downpour is worth more than a thousand watering cans!" So said Benson our gardener (actually it's Stephen) after witnessing some decent rain over the past few days. It's done wonders for all the things we're trying to grow this year, as well as all the things we're not trying to grow but that come up anyway.

We hope to use a good deal of **our own produce on the menu** whenever we can. With any luck, this will include lettuces, cucumbers, tomatoes, herbs, radishes, spring onions, chard, potatoes, turnips, broad beans, spinach, apples, peas, strawberries, blackcurrants, blueberries (last year our six bushes produced five whole berries between them) and more.

If you'd like to look round our herb garden in particular, come to West Winds during our **Celebration of Herbs Week** between Saturday 18 and Sunday 26 June 2011. Our menu will be even more herbalicious than normal and Benson will be conducting tours around the pots where we are growing more than 20 different varieties of herb.
