In September UWRSG hosted our third 'refugee Welcome Day' with groups from Bradford, Blackburn with Darwin and Skipton joining us for a day of sport, walking, eating and socialising. There was also children's play, including model making, and scone making for both children and adults.

In all, about 60 adults and nearly as many children (they didn't stay still long enough to be counted!) came to Kettlewell for the day.

The weather was mixed but we were able to get out in the dry and our visitors loved the hills and Kettlewell Village.

We are very grateful to all those who made it possible: the people of Littondale for providing the cakes, Kettlewell for the sandwiches and savouries, and Buckden for salads and quiches; the Theodosius family and friends for organising the activities;

Kettlewell Village for allowing us the use of the hall at no cost;

those who helped on the day with the activities, food preparation and child minding; People in the Dales Project for funding the buses and the volunteers who organised and transported our guests.

Our visitors really appreciated the welcome and effort local people had made and we really appreciated the fun and friendship our visitors brought. Although many of our visitors have experienced traumatic events and life remains very uncertain, it was a wonderful day of song, laughter and play.



Many thanks to all those who contributed over the summer to the collection of household goods for families in Bradford. In all, we collected a full three car loads of goods.

### Wartime in Upper Wharfedale WW1 1914-1918

**6 November 2018** . ### Christmas gifts and SNUG packs

This year we are taking a lead from the 'Two Dales' refugee support group (Swaledale and Arkengarthdale) and undertaking a collection of Christmas gifts for refugees. The refugees for whom we are collecting (BIASAN in Bradford) are in need of necessities so we are looking to collect toiletries; warm winter clothing such as hats, gloves and socks; food items with a long shelf life (jars, tins, dried foods); and clothes, toys, books and stationery for children. Toys and books do not need to be new but must be clean and in good condition. Once again we will be collecting **SNUG packs** (Socks, a Neck scarf or hat, Underpants, and Gloves) for refugees in Calais and other camps.
