Requests for help

If any of you are wondering how best to support those who might be cold this winter, we are collecting winter coats for BIASAN (men's and children's are particularly needed). We can also arrange for anyone who wants to donate their winter fuel payment (or part of) to BIASAN to support refugees in fuel poverty.

Upper Wharfedale Churches Together (Christian Aid) will be **carol singing** for refugees and the earth's poorest at Tesco on 20 December 2-4pm. Everyone is welcome to join in the singing.

The number of **Ukrainian refugees** that have come to the UK and to the area have slowed significantly. Requests for homes continues though and the recent resurgence of Russian bombing of cities means they may fluctuate but the need will remain. We are still looking for landlords who can offer permanent or longer-term accommodation. Ukrainians are primarily working but many have children and cannot work full time. Rent (up to a certain level) is covered by benefits but is less than is usually charged in the Dale. If you feel you can offer accommodation, there are plenty of people who will support you and your guest/ tenant. Please get in touch with Nicky <u>nicola.corp@mustardmanagement.com</u>

Local **Ukrainian fundraiser**. UWRSG has been raising funds to provide transport for Ukrainian refugees or their hosts. And we have had donations of two old cars which also requires some fundraising for costs (Nicky again). Alongside this UW Ukrainians and hosts have benefited hugely from the work of **Skipton and Craven Ukrainian Refugee Support** which has a regular coffee morning with games, English lessons, free toiletries and food. It has been very successful in helping families come together, support hosts and help integration but has now run out of money.
